Treasurer's Report: Kara Minchin

 - We have \$160K in the bank, seen on balance sheet
 - Actual vs budget. Some outstanding bills have not been posted but have been paid
 - Adult and player registration estimates were estimated pretty well
 - Under for players but over for Adult and coach registrations
 - Have not spending on disabled or diversity. Limited spend for goaltending. Did a great job on girls. Encourage focus in these areas
 - Within budget & under expenses at the moment
 - Big bills still coming in
 - As outgoing treasurer – requesting some days for transition. It will be difficult for her because she is going to school right now.
 - Joy was the only one that ran for treasurer
 - We had a USA Audit in December
 - Request that someone reviews her books to ensure full transparency priori to handoff.
 - This could be a good ask for our New VP
 - We do not officially have an audit committee

 - SafeSport – renewal now every 12 months.
 - Notices are sent out when there is 30 days left
 - 23-24 plan. Continue Zoom online trainings for level 4 courses.
 - Level 4 and 5 extensions are out there now
 - Classes will get out in the next 90 days or so.
 - First training in Dallas this past weekend.
 - Full requirements are added on the report.
 - Andy is nationally known as an educator. We did not have a budget for this position. We want to start supporting this
 - Andy is asked to attend the Colorado June meetings as a CIC
 - Pacific district is having a player development meeting and Andy will go for Lester
 - Also want to send Andy to a level 5
 - Do we want to add to the budget as a line item or make it a one off and address again next year?
 - Kara suggests making a line item in the budget
 - \$2200 in disabled, \$1500 in Goalie development. Kara suggests adding what we think the costs were going to be instead of shifting things over
 - Ask for \$3000 for the two trips Andy will do

Girls Hockey Development Report: Joy Pendowski

- (see GHD Report attached)
 - Oregon girls finished strong, Gold, Silver and Bronze brought home
 - Girls district camp May 4-7th
 - We all should think about how to get more girls in the programs, 8 and 10u specifically
 - Challenges
 - No Affiliate rep at district
 - Celebrate some success in WA – Tier II girls won nationals

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- But will continue to pull girls North
- The numbers in the report and based off girls that are registered in Oregon
 - 140 girls registered in the state
 - Identified who is playing elsewhere.
 - 12U and 14U numbers are the strongest
 - Might be able to pull off a 16U team.
 - Joy suggests having a tryouts – June 17th suggestion
 - Joy believes we have goalies to cover the ages
 - The last bullet has a LINK to the USA hockey website.
- Associations can get lists of girls of each association over to Joy

Goaltending Development Report: Christy Picard Dimmig

- (see GDC Report attached)
 - Continuing coaching educations
 - Silver level has added some on ice training
 - Encourage to get all to have bronze level education
 - Get as many coaches bronze certified as we can
 - Like to look at Sept or Oct to do a dev clinic for goalies
 - Development camp has about ½ as many goaltenders as the previous season
 - Pacific district high performance camp happening in August in Seattle (2009 birth year)
 - Goalie coaching development summit in June in CO Springs
 - Recommend getting quick change gear orders in early.

Player Development Report: Lester Sparks:

- Sent players to camp. New people doing new things this year
 - Off ice person
 - Yoga
 - Good numbers for the entire weekend
 - Gave people more time. Moving forward – shift out birth years to another tryout weekend to extend more ice for the camp.
 - Overall – seems we are doing a good job

State Tournaments/Jamborees: Sarah Chambers

- There is a lot if ice and moving parts for one weekend
- Congrats to the teams who won the state championship
 - Possible split into two weekends for the state tournament
 - Possibly split the 8s and 10s
- Aaron suggests making the tournaments as more of an event
 - Banners, Balloons ect
- Gerard – Two sets of boards for 8u would be a positive for all associations
- Suggesting using 2 sets of boards instead of one boards at the other bumpers
 - Andy is the only one who has 2 sets of boards.

Brief Description of programs and initiatives aimed at growing participation and retention of players: The 2 main programs we have in Eugene for growing participation and developing adult players for the REHL are the Adult Intro to Hockey and Adult Hockey Academy. The Intro to Hockey Program is for beginners and focuses on the 5 main skills of hockey (skating, stickhandling, shooting, passing, and body contact) the same way a beginner youth hockey program does. The main purpose of this program is to prepare a new player for playing in the REHL C League. The Adult Hockey Academy is more for people who already play in C League and want to hone their skills so they can move up to REHL B League. The main focus is still the 5 main skills of hockey but also begins to teach some more advanced skills.

There are several ways the RHL works to retain players. The first is to draft teams every season to try to make the teams as equal as possible. This creates a more competitive league and prevents players from dropping out because they are on the worst team season after season. In addition to the draft, there is a mid-season calibration where league officials and the captains sit down and evaluate how the teams are doing. If one team is too strong or too weak, trades will be made to try to even the teams out. Because of this system, players often form friendships with many of the players on other teams which results in a sense of community among the players and creates a friendly but still competitive environment. The last thing we do to retain players is to identify players that behave in reckless or dangerous manners. These players are warned and if they don't change these behaviors they are banned from the league.
